

PHILLIP TAHMINDJIS
CURRICULUM VITAE

Dr Phillip Tahmindjis is the IBA Programme Lawyer. His particular responsibilities have included the establishment of a bar association in Afghanistan, capacity building for the Law Society of Swaziland, human rights training for lawyers in Iraq and Palestine, humanitarian law training in the Former Yugoslavia, rule of law missions to Russia and Nepal, the establishment of global guidelines for human rights fact finding, running the IBA's electronic Rule of Law Directory, and managing the updating of the UN/IBA Human Rights Training Manual. He is also a trustee of the Southern Africa Litigation Centre.

Admitted to the bar of New South Wales in 1978, Dr Tahmindjis was for 25 years a Professor of Human Rights, teaching and researching in Australia, North America and Hong Kong. He has been a consultant to private industry and government with respect to the implementation of human rights (particularly with respect to anti-discrimination measures) and is the author of four books and several articles in this area, the most recent being *Sexuality and Human Rights: A Global Overview* (Haworth Pres, 2005) and the 2005 special issue of the *International Journal of Discrimination and the Law* devoted to comparative studies of sexual harassment laws.

He was for three years a Member of the Queensland Anti-Discrimination Tribunal and is a trained mediator.
